MONTHLY BOARD MEETING

February 18, 2019

The Board of Education of the Hubbard-Radcliffe Community School District met Monday, February 18, 2019 in the Library at the Radcliffe School. Board members present Jacob Bolson, Brandy Eilbeck, Keith England and Bob Westendorf presiding. Leon Schwartz was absent. Others present were: Superintendent Adam Zellmer; Middle School Principal Joe Taylor; Elementary Principal Brian Mangold; Board Secretary Debra England; coach – Rex Crosser and media—Corey Meints.

Bob Westendorf called the regular meeting to order at 6:32PM.

Motion by Bolson, seconded by England to approve the agenda. MC

Motion by Eilbeck, seconded by Bolson to approve the minutes from the January 21, 2019 regular board meeting and the reports on budget and warrants. MC

There was no community input.

Dr. Zellmer presented some information on the MS football helmet inventory and possible funding sources. MS Football Coach Rex Crosser presented the need for middle school Football Helmets for the next few years and a couple of plans for updating the helmets.

Mr. Mangold reported trying to finish up Parent-Teacher conferences because due to weather one had to be rescheduled. Each family was given a copy of the book, Nim's Island by Wendy Orr at conferences to read and enjoy together at home. On Friday, March 29th, there will be a family movie night featuring the movie, Nim's Island. Preschool registration is open for the 2019-2020 school year. Every Elementary class completed an Ag in the Classroom lesson the first week in February. The Great Kindness Challenge was a success.

Mr. Taylor reported the winter sports season is finished. The MS Valentine's Dance was a success. Spring sports practice begins on March 4th with the students staying in Hubbard for the first couple of weeks until the weather improves. There is a Running Club this spring for students in grades 2nd-8th

Mr. Rundall sent a high school report.

Motion by England, seconded by Bolson to approve the Whole Grade Sharing Agreement for Activities required by the state activity associations. MC

Motion by Eilbeck, seconded by England to approve the Fundraiser request for the HR Elementary. MC

Dr. Zellmer shared some 2018-19 makeup day options with the board.

Dr. Zellmer showed some 2019-20 calendar options to the board and asked for their input.

Dr. Zellmer shared the plan to address the priorities and looking at setting up a 3-year Comprehensive School Improvement Plan with the Leaders of Learning and Admin Teams. A draft will be shared at the joint board meeting.
